What did you learn about yourself through work with Greenagers?

I learned a lot about the type of environment I'd like to work in when I have a more permanent job in the future. I learned that I love working outdoors and that I'm a lot more interested in this kind of conservation and sustainability work than I had ever thought I would be. More specifically, I've learned the type of work I like within Trail Crew. I really love doing the more technical stuff like stonework/bridge building. I get to use my hands and my brain, and it feels like a mix between art and a giant 3D puzzle. I also have learned through my time on the spike crew that I am far more tenacious than I gave myself credit for – it has been equally the most trying and yet most fulfilling experience of my life.
